A few things we won't tolerate in this role:

- No AI slop practice problems! LLMs can be a useful tool, but your expertise, experience, and creativity will be important to create high-quality problems.
- No plagiarising problems from other course vendors
- No copying problems from recent CAS exams or violating your exam NDA

Requirements

- Passed the exam you'd like to write problems for (7+ score preferred, not required)
- Strong understanding of the content outline source material
- Work experience related to the exam (preferred, not required)
- Excellent writing skills
- Strong attention to detail to avoid errors in problems and solutions
- Creativity to write non-trivial, high-quality practice problems
- Ability to explain difficult concepts in problem solutions
